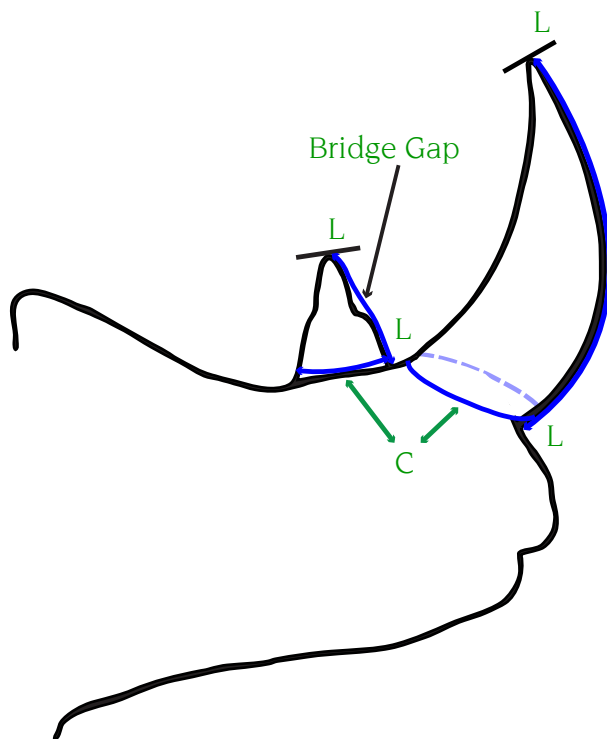

Method 16

Rhinoceros from Africa and Asia

Length: Measure the length on the front curve of each horn from the base to the tip. **(L)** In case the horn has an injury or a piece missing, the tape measure must bridge such gaps and must not be pushed into the depressions. All broken tips must be carded off.

Circumference: Measure around the base of each horn. **(C)** The temptation is to follow the uneven edges of the horn (wave the tape measure), which will result in a very much higher score for the circumference. This is wrong. As with the measurements of antelope horns, the circumference must only measure horn, not skin. To make sure you are measuring just the horn, measure them only in strong daylight. The tape measure must form one continuous circle. Do not follow the uneven edge of the horn.
